We want to take this opportunity to express our gratitude to all of JBI's supporters, partners, volunteers, staff, and other friends. With your dedicated assistance in 2022, JBI emerged from "Covid-times" to a time of broadened outreach, exciting new projects, production enhancements, and new collaborations. Cultivating partnerships with social service organizations, advocacy groups, publishers of content of Jewish interest, the Jewish movements, and other libraries has been a major focus over the past year. During 2022, we recruited new board members with fresh voices and diversity of skills, backgrounds, and experiences.

All that JBI does is focused on our mission to provide people of all ages and backgrounds who are blind, have low vision, are print disabled, or are reading disabled with the accessible materials they need to participate more fully in educational, cultural, and communal life. JBI's role is to fulfill the unique requests of our patrons and ensure that they are not excluded due to the inability to read standard print.

JBI is currently nearing the end of a strategic planning process, and we know we will be pursuing several areas to meet our expanded goals. These include an investment in technology to better serve our current patrons and to attract a wider audience, increasing our programmatic offerings to enhance the ways we engage people, improving our outreach to reach more people who could benefit from our services, and amplifying impact through advocating for accessibility. We look forward to sharing more about JBI's new strategic plan with you in the months to come.

JBI serves people ranging in age from the youngest readers and students wishing to pursue a Jewish education or mark important Jewish milestones, to adults who want to access the written word for pleasure, information, or religious observance, to families seeking to read together—and everyone in between with an interest in Jewish life and culture. We know that many of our library patrons, especially older adults with low vision, would otherwise be more isolated than ever. For them, JBI's books, periodicals, liturgical texts, and cultural programs are a lifeline.

Thank you for your support and for your caring. JBI's work would not be possible without you.

- We commenced transcription
 of a new Braille Siddur, created
 Braille editions of three new
 Haggadot, and began offering
 twin vision children's books
 (braille transparency over printed
 picture books), underscoring
 our commitment to braille
 production;
- We explored collaborations
 with organizations including PJ
 Library, Jewish Book Council,
 Matan, and JASA in order to
 serve broader populations that
 may benefit from our services;
- We began increasing our social media presence with more frequent Facebook posts, and expanded other outreach efforts to directly reach more individuals about our work;
- We produced and distributed
 4,500 large print and braille
 liturgical and lifecycle materials,
 including our braille and large
 print luach;
- We circulation 13,000 audiobooks;
- We regularly produced and distributed audio magazines and cultural programs for more than 1,000 magazine readers;

- We initiated the first step in upgrading our technology to better support our patrons and provide easier access to our materials;
- We engaged 1,350 new patrons through our circulating library, liturgical and lifecycle materials, customized offerings, or cultural programming;
- We strengthened relationships
 with colleagues at organizations
 such as Xavier Society for
 the Blind, CSB Cares, Visions,
 Vision Services Alliance, The
 Lighthouse/Guild, and the
 National Library Services of
 the Library of Congress, and
 discussed new ways to partner,
 share information, and learn from
 one another;
- We increased our regular communication with our patrons through frequent newsletters (braille and large print, as well as via email) in order to share updates, keep our patrons informed and encourage their input in asking for what they need;
- We awarded four exceptional college and graduate students with The Nathan L. and Suzanne K. Wolfson Scholarships.


